Vista Grande to be Replaced with Dining Complex

The Cal Poly Corporation has announced plans to replace Vista Grande dining hall with a state-of-the-art dining facility. Construction is scheduled to begin in summer, with project completion planned for fall 2018. The existing 16,899-square-foot building will be replaced with a three-story, 35,000-square-foot facility. The new building will be LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) certified. It will feature large patios outside with comfortable seating and fireplaces. Inside, there will be six micro-restaurants serving a variety of healthy cuisine. The interior will accommodate 350 seats, including lounge areas with game tables and other elements that promote a social experience. A transition plan has been developed to support dining demand, including renovating several of Campus Dining's existing restaurants, expanding hours of service, and creating several new dining concepts. The Cal Poly Corporation will also purchase two new food trucks to help fill the dining gap.
