Volunteers Needed for Osteoporosis Study

Female faculty and staff members are invited to participate in a research study on osteoporosis that will be used as part of a Cal Poly master's thesis. Researchers hope to learn more about how the body reacts to a single bout of exercise while wearing a weighted exercise suit. Results from this study will further the body of research surrounding the effects of exercise on osteoporosis and may influence future treatment and maintenance options. The study will consist of two exercise trials and six blood draws over a two-week period in Kinesiology Department facilities. Women between 45 and 65 years old who are post-menopausal, have been diagnosed with osteoporosis, are sedentary or lightly active, and have abstained from taking any osteoporosis medication for at least six months may be eligible to participate.
