#### **Rodeo Program Receives Record Donation**

At this year's 76th annual Poly Royal Rodeo, Mark and Jessie Milano announced they would establish a \$1 million endowment to benefit the Cal Poly Rodeo team in perpetuity. The largest donation in the program's history, the funds will provide scholarships to student athletes for their performance both in and out of the arena. Leadership, academic performance, athletic contribution, financial need, teamwork and camaraderie will all be considered. The gift will increase the program's scholarship offerings to \$80,000 in 2016-17, up from \$16,000 awarded in 2015-16. Mark Milano, a cattle rancher and retired oil industry executive, said he admires Cal Poly's Learn by Doing philosophy and the rodeo program's reverence of the Western way of life.
