Inclusion Starts With Me Week Continues Through Feb. 2

The final event of Inclusion Starts With Me Week, hosted by the Office of Diversity and Inclusivity, will take place Thursday, Feb. 2. A dialogue on police and community relations will be held from 2 to 3 p.m. at Congregation Beth David, 10180 Los Osos Valley Road in San Luis Obispo. Panelists include San Luis Obispo Police Chief Deanna Cantrell, criminal law attorney Jeff Stein, David Conn of the Five Cities Diversity Coalition, Cal Poly's Camille O'Bryant, professor in the Kinesiology Department and associate dean in the College of Science and Mathematics, and Bryan Shon Hubain, assistant dean of students and director of Cross Cultural Centers.

University Employees Win Rideshare's 2016 Commuter Challenge

Cal Poly finished first among San Luis Obispo County's largest employers for logging the most non-single occupant vehicle trips in 2016 in a countywide competition. University commuters also saved 218.4 tons of carbon dioxide emissions while saving \$288,515 in commuting costs — or nearly \$1,400 per participant, said Peter Williamson, SLO Regional Rideshare's employer outreach coordinator. In 2016, the university had 208 employees cycling, walking or carpooling and logging on Rideshare's website trips and distances traveled. The group logged 47,014 trips over 849,733.7 miles. Among university participants, cyclist Scott Loosley, director for Facilities Operations and a Cal Poly alumnus, recorded the most lunch and commute trips — 851, at more than 1,061.9 miles. Cal Poly offers incentives including cash per trips, prizes, designated parking spaces for carpoolers, and bike lockers and bike repair stations for cyclists. "We also have 10 employee vanpools operating throughout the county and Santa Maria," said Commuter Services Coordinator Cheryl Andrus. "We provide subsidized bus fares allowing the Cal Poly community to ride city transit with their current Cal Poly ID and subsidized countywide bus passes." The campus has eight Zipcars located throughout campus if an individual needs a vehicle for part of a day.

Modification Made to CSU Travel Policy Changes

In September, the California Legislature passed a bill that prohibits state agencies from requiring, funding or sponsoring travel to certain states — specifically those with laws permitting discrimination on the basis of sexual orientation or gender identity. Since Jan. 1, travel to these states by employees, officers or members of the CSU system will not be authorized, with limited exceptions. The CSU travel policy has been amended to satisfy the new law. University Campus Program funding sources are considered state funding sources and as such are subject to the prohibition. Travel that is funded from an auxiliary funding source is not subject to this ban.
